Assigned Individuals will be permitted to operate equipment and vehicles. All equipment and vehicle operators will follow the posted speed limit and parking zone signs. Pay attention to machines that seems to be having issues which could place staff at risk. Staff is trained to report equipment issues immediately. It is the responsibility of the supervisor to report these issues to the project manager. As well, all staff has the right to directly report injuries and incidents to the project manager.
