WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to propose an ordinance
for adoption to amend the Alachua County Charter to require identification and elimination
of racial, economic and gender bias in County policies.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. **Authorization and Legislative Findings.** This Ordinance is authorized by Chapter 125, Part IV, Florida Statutes, and Article IV, Sections 4.2(C) and 4.2(D), Alachua County Charter, and other applicable law. The Board of County Commissioners finds and declares that all the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct and are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Amendments to the Alachua County Home Rule Charter. The proposed amendment to the Alachua County Charter adding Section 1.8 pertaining racial, economic and gender equity, set forth in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein, is proposed for adoption in accordance with Subsection 4.2(C)(1), Alachua County Charter.

SECTION 3. Referendum.

a. The proposed amendment to the Alachua County Charter in Section 2 of this ordinance shall be presented to the County electorate on the ballot at the general election to be held on November 3, 2020.

b. The Supervisor of Elections of Alachua County shall cause the following question to be placed on the ballot at the general election to be held on November 3, 2020:

IDENTIFICATION AND ELIMINATION OF RACIAL, ECONOMIC AND GENDER BIAS IN ALACHUA COUNTY POLICIES

 Shall the Alachua County Charter be amended to require the Board of County Commissioners to examine County policies for elements of racial, economic, and gender bias in the design and delivery of County programs or services; to identify and act to mitigate and improve upon the effects, patterns, and disparities imposed by said bias?

SECTION 4. Effective Date of Charter Amendment.

This amendment to the Alachua County Charter adopted as set forth in Exhibit "A" shall be effective on January 1, 2021, only if approved by a majority of the electors voting in the general election to be held on November 3, 2020.

SECTION 5. Inclusion in the Code, Scrivener's Error. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Alachua County, Florida, and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Alachua County, Florida; that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention; and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate designation. The correction of typographical errors which do not affect the intent of the ordinance may be authorized by the

County Manager or designee without public hearing, by filing a corrected or recodified copy of the same with the Clerk of the Circuit Court.

SECTION 6. **Severability.** It is the declared intent of the Board of County Commissioners that, if any section, sentence, clause, phrase or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held or declared to be unconstitutional, void, or inoperative by a court or agency of competent jurisdiction, such holding of invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining provisions of this ordinance, and the remainder of this ordinance after the exclusion of such part or parts shall be deemed to be valid.

SECTION 7. Liberal Construction and Interpretation. This ordinance shall be liberally construed in order to effectively carry out the purposes hereof which are deemed to be in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and residents of Alachua County, Florida.

SECTION 8. **Modification**. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this ordinance may be modified as a result of considerations that may arise during public hearings. Such modifications shall be incorporated into the final version of the ordinance adopted by the Board and filed by the Clerk to the Board.

SECTION 9. **Effective Date.** A certified copy of this ordinance shall be filed with the Department of State by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners within ten (10) days after enactment by the Board of County Commissioners, and this ordinance shall take effect upon filing with the Department of State.
