## ORDINANCE adopted by BoCC on May 25, 2021 Purpose

- to provide a continuing, non-lapsing fund
- to create and sustain affordable housing throughout Alachua County for renters and homeowners, and increase workforce housing opportunities
- Community Support Services will administer the Trust via Housing Programs

#### Revenue Sources

- The Trust Fund may be funded by the following sources:
  - Alachua County General Revenue (current)
  - Fees from new commercial and residential development
  - Other revenue sources as directed by the BoCC, including those referenced in Alachua County Charter Review Commission Resolution 2020-04

#### Resolution 2020-04

In addition, Resolution 2020-04 named other revenue sources:

- -Funds voluntarily contributed by municipalities that elect to participate in the Trust Fund and programs funded by the Trust Fund
- -Grants or donations of money, property or other thing of value
- -Mandatory or voluntary payments, including but not limited to fees from new commercial and residential development
- -Other sources, as established Infrastructure Surtax (if approved by votes)

#### Fund Use Options

**Budget Allocation: \$250,000 annually for 4 years** 

- Initial Proposed Projects
  - Alachua County Housing Vouchers -\$50,000
  - Homeowner Roof Replacement
  - Handicap accessible modifications to owned homes

#### **Fund Use Options**

- Potential Expansion with Additional Funding
  - Implement Affordable Housing/energy efficiency program upon depletion of ARP funds
  - Homes that are in a condition where rehab/renovation is prohibitive:
    - Mobile/Modular Home Replacement\*
    - Standard Home Replacement\*
  - Land Acquisition to build workforce housing

## Fund Use Options (cont'd)

- Acquire land for Community Land Trust
- **Tax Foreclosure** 
  - Acquire deeds that are in default to repurpose.
  - Deed purchase for resale.
- Contribution (loan) to LIHTC projects
- Any other use that creates or sustains affordable housing as determined by BoCC

### **Staff Recommendations**

- Approve annual budget allocation of \$250,000 for four years;
  and Initial Proposed Projects
  - Alachua County Housing Vouchers -\$50,000
  - Homeowner Roof Replacement
  - Handicap accessible modifications to owned homes
