 - **3.** <u>21-0281</u> Update and Accomplishments to Date for Community Redevelopment Funds for the Gainesville Metropolitan Area

<u>Fiscal Consideration:</u> Working Food has invoiced the County once in February 2021. The total amount remaining for reallocation in a revised agreement is \$45,288.82.

No further grant applications will be accepted, per the Board's June 2020 direction, unless new direction is given by the Board.

Staff requests that the Board extend Working Food's agreement term to December 31, 2021 and allow them to expend remaining funds on the youth culinary program.

The resources for these efforts are funded from a portion of financial contributions committed by the County to the Gainesville Community Revitalization Area agreement (GCRA). Alachua County's annual commitment to the GCRA starting in 2020 is \$4,191,460 with an increment drawdown of \$100,000 annually for 10 years to reach equity with the City of Gainesville to \$3,325,657 per year. The Community Redevelopment Fund in the first year (2020), had a \$100,000 increment available for economic development projects and thereafter grows by \$100,000 per year over ten years per Section 3 of the GCRA agreement. These funds are in account 001.17.1770.552.46.00.

Recommended Action: Accept presentation and amend Working Food's agreement to extend the term through December 31, 2021, allow for the majority of remaining funds to be used for the youth culinary program, and a smaller percentage to support continued engagement and collaboration in Workforce Development activities related to local food systems.

4. <u>21-0298</u> Sports Events Center 60% Plans Review and Project Update

Fiscal Consideration: After 30% design, significant deviation from the programmatic offerings or building components may negatively impact the financial pro forma. Any change requested by the County to the design plans following approval of the 60% design plans that increase the development budget for the Event Center shall be the responsibility of the County in addition to the \$30M in TDT funding.

Per the Pre-Development Agreement, if the County elects to not proceed with the development, then Viking may be entitled to reimbursement of costs not to exceed \$1 Million for the preparation of design and construction documents incurred to date.

Contingent on the Board continuing past the 60% Design and an eventual Comprehensive Agreement with the Developer at a future board meeting, the County's total obligation for the project would be \$30 Million from TDT funds via 30-year bond issuance. This amount may be increased for the use of energy management funds to commission the building systems to meet sustainability goals and/or the use of American Rescue Plan funds to implement "well building" standards.

The land and the building when constructed will be owned by the County.

 Recommended Action:
 Approve the 60% Design Plans in accordance with the Predevelopment Agreement and direct staff to continue to engage with the development team on the design to maximize the sports events potential of the facility while maintaining the financial pro forma. Allow for the use of 1917 energy management funds for the commissioning of building systems in support of sustainability goals for operations and utility performance.

- *Fiscal Consideration:* The Sellers, Hitchcock and Sons Inc. and Hitchcocks Ranch LLC, had accepted contingent offers from County staff of \$2,598.42 per surveyed acre, for an estimated total of \$5,381,327.82, for the conservation easements over 2,071 acres owned by the entities. The offers were contingent on the award of grants from NRCS for up to one-half of the purchase price. The recommended action would remove the contingency for the NRCS grant and add an additional 205 acres to the project. The seller has indicated a willingness to donate 50% of the value of the easement over the additional 205 acres of land. Assuming a constant per acre price, the total easement cost would be \$5,647,665.87 plus closing costs.

This would be funded with Wild Spaces Public Places funds, and the Department has set aside this amount for this purchase in its planning. Sufficient cash and budget exist for this purchase. If the Department is able to purchase the property, the funding would be in spent from the following account: 021.41.4160.537.61.00 -6194101- Santa Fe River - Hitchcock Estimated annual Alachua County Forever management costs:

The current annual property tax revenue of the ownership will not change due to the conservation easement.

18. <u>21-0319</u> Acceptance of the Warny Donation Subject to Access Issues

Fiscal Consideration: The Corrective Road Grade Crossing Easement from CSX Transportation, Inc. (CSX Easement) requires that Watermelon Triangle Corporation, Inc. (WTC) and its members to indemnify CSX for damages and injuries resulting from the use of the crossing, and it also requires WTC to maintain liability insurance. The premium is divided among paying members. Currently, there is no cap on the liability of WTC and its members under the Crossing Agreement. However, the CSX Easement provides that WTC and its members can cap their collective liability if WTC maintains liability insurance with coverage of \$3 million per occurrence. To date, WTC has only carried insurance with a \$1 million per occurrence limit. The latest information received by the County indicated an annual premium of \$1,085 for this policy. An assessment charged to the County by WTC for this policy and its corporate filing fee was \$105.56. This assessment will be paid from the General fund budget of

This assessment will be paid from the General fund budget of Land Conservation, 001.41.4160.537.xx.xx. As mentioned in the previous, related agenda item, annual operating costs will be approximately \$2,500 and will be paid from the Land Conservation portion of Wild Spaces Public Places, 021.41.4160.537.46.00. There is sufficient budget for both components.
