Professional Summary

For more than six decades in higher education, I have devoted much of my research, teaching, and public service to African Studies and the Black experience in the Diaspora. My focus includes public policy issues, human/civil rights, organizational capacity building and sustainability, transformational leadership, public health issues including substance abuse prevention and treatment. Among my scholarly works are: 34 books, 8 training manuals, 11 monographs, 15 chapters, 35 refereed articles in academic journals, 25 research reports, 76 papers, numerous abstracts, editorial works, films, and interviews.

My research activities have largely informed my leadership, teaching, and public service. I have directed and/or served on 25 doctoral dissertation committees and 15 master's thesis committees. I received and managed approximately \$4.5 million in research and community service grants during my tenure at the University of Kansas. I retired from KU in 2004 as the first African American Professor Emeritus. I have continued to be professionally active and engaged.

In 2012, I received an award to serve as a Fulbright Senior Specialist to Ghana. Upon completion of that assignment, I was appointed as the Kwame Nkrumah Endowed Chair in African Studies at the University of Ghana, 2012-2015. In 2013 I received a grant of \$110,000 from the Open Society Initiative for West Africa (OSIWA) to study African Presidential Leadership and Governance.

I currently serve on the Boards of the United Nations Association-USA Gainesville Chapter, University of Florida African American Studies Program, International Bullying Prevention Association (IBPA), Alachua County African American History Task Force; and I am a founding Board Member of the Alachua County African & African American Historical Society, Inc.
