L5	WHEREAS, the natural beauty of native wildflowers in Alachua County can be enjoyed
L6	by everyone; can enhance tourism and benefit commerce, environmental health, and public well-
L 7	being; and
L 8	WHEREAS, enjoyment of native wildflowers is an occasion for all County and
L9	community leaders to unite for the benefit of everyone; and
20	WHEREAS, many naturally beautiful species of native wildflowers, including
21	Coreopsis, the state wildflower, as depicted upon the State Wildflower license tag, are already
22	prominently displayed along Alachua County's state and county roadways; and
23	WHEREAS the County's Comprehensive Plan states that "the County shall promote and
24	protect the visual characteristics of wildflower areas through planting programs and maintenance
25	practices, in cooperation with other agencies and private landowners;" and
26	WHEREAS, wildflowers are part of the landscaping goals of many County rural property
27	owners and community-based organizations including the Old Florida Heritage Highway, a state
28	designated scenic byway; and

1	WHEREAS, the presence of native wildflowers is essential to the fitness of native
2	pollinator species necessary for productive and profitable farms and forests; and
3	WHEREAS, in the spring of 1513, Juan Ponce de Leon named this beautiful place La
4	Florida, Land of Flowers, because of the wealth of native wildflowers; and
5	WHEREAS, in the year 2013, native wildflowers will be a prominent icon of Florida's
6	and Alachua County's quincentennial celebration of Spain's role in Florida history; and
7	WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Florida, Article II, Section 7(a) states, "I
8	shall be the policy of the state to conserve and protect its natural resources and scenic beauty
9	(Adopted 1996); and
10	WHEREAS, it is desirable and attainable to experience the beauty of many more native
11	wildflowers, and Alachua County minimizes the frequency and extent of mowing to encourage
12	the growth of wildflowers; and
13	WHEREAS, along US 441 and County Road 225, part of the Old Florida Heritage
14	Highway, roadsides are presently managed for native wildflowers by FDOT, Alachua County
15	and local residents; and
16	WHEREAS, pursuant to this resolution government agencies and non-profi
17	organizations in Alachua County may consider applications to the Florida Wildflowe
18	Foundation grants program.

20 21	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
22	ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA:
23	1. That they do hereby encourage the conservation of roadside native wildflowers or
