18	WHEREAS, human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery, which involves the
19	exploitation of persons for commercial sex or forced labor and often subjects victims to force,
20	fraud and coercion; and
21	WHEREAS, while many victims of human trafficking are forced to work in prostitution
22	or the sexual entertainment industry, trafficking also occurs in forms of labor exploitation, such
23	as domestic servitude and restaurants, janitorial, sweatshop factory and agricultural work; and
24	WHEREAS, traffickers use various techniques to instill fear in victims to keep them
25	enslaved such as isolation, threats of imprisonment and deportation, confiscation of passports,
26	visas or other identification documents and threats of violence toward victims or their families;
27	and
28	WHEREAS, Florida law authorizes counties to enforce posting of human trafficking
29	public awareness signs in certain establishments; and,
30	WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Ordinance to promote, protect, and improve the health,
31	safety, and welfare of the residents of Alachua County by creating Chapter 84 of the Alachua

3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
4	COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:
5	SECTION 1. The Board of County Commissioners finds and declares that all statements
6	in the preamble of the ordinance are true and correct.
7	SECTION 2. Title 7 of the Alachua County Code, entitled "Health and Safety," is hereby
8	amended, creating Chapter 84, as follows:

30	Human trafficking means transporting, soliciting, recruiting, harboring, providing, enticing,
31	maintaining, or obtaining another person for the purpose of exploitation of that person regulated
32	pursuant to Chapter 787, Florida Statutes, and defined in Section 787.06, Florida Statutes, as
33	may be amended.

35	Massage services means the manipulation of the soft tissues of the human body with the hand,
36	foot, arm, or elbow, whether or not such manipulation is aided by hydrotherapy, including
37	colonic irrigation, or thermal therapy; any electrical or mechanical device; or the application to
38	the human body of a chemical or herbal preparation.

31	SECTION 5. Modification. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that	at						
32	the provisions of this ordinance may be modified as a result of considerations that may arise							
33	during public hearings. Such modifications shall be incorporated into the final version of the							
34	ordinance adopted by the Board and filed by the Clerk to the Board.							
35	SECTION 6. Severability. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision	1 of						
36	this ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or							
37	unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the							

ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or
application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

3 SECTION 7. Inclusion in the Code, Scrivener's Error. It is the intention of the Board of 4 County Commissioners of Alachua County, Florida, and it is hereby provided that the provisions 5 of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Alachua County, Florida; that the section of this ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such 6 7 intent and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or other appropriate 8 designation. The correction of typographical errors that do not affect the intent of the ordinance may be authorized by the County Manager or designee, without public hearing, by filing a 9 corrected or re-codified copy of the same with the Clerk of the Circuit Court. 10 SECTION 8. Effective Date.
