What draws me to this project specifically is the license plates as material to be repurposed. My portfolio has many examples of public art projects but more specifically projects that utilize repurposed materials. I believe this makes me more that qualified to complete the piece.


Fender Bender (2018)



Bicycle Carousel (2015)



Repurposed buttons, plastic underlay, plywood, LED rope light, adhesive, 10'x8'x6", Charleston South Carolina.




Rackem' (2014)






Alachua In Bloom

The piece will depict a variety of Florida wild flowers crafted from the license plates being provided. The design is meant to be a reminder to the beauty that is the natural Florida environment. Some of the flowers represented in the piece will be the oakleaf fleabane, yellowtops, the wild petunia and the official state flower of Florida the Orange Blossom as well as others. Each of the flowers created will be a miniature sculpture intended to be fascinating in craft and detail. This will provide the most visual impact. The color scheme will be determined by the license plates themselves making a collage of images and symbols.



The wall piece titled *Alachua In Bloom* will be specifically built for the Downtown Tax Collector Customer Waiting Area. The art will measure 16' x 4', 6" tall however the dimensions are negotiable. The piece will have a relief aspect to it as each flower will be 3 dimensional and come off the wall. This effect will measure between 2-10 inches also negotiable. It will be built in three sections in order to transport easily and install in only two hours. The installation of the art work will be done by a small crew of assistance and myself. The wall sculpture will be built on ¾" plywood and fastened to the wall on a French cleat. This will provide more than adequate safety and security. The approximate weight of the art would be 50-75 LBS and the life span would be a minimum of 20 years. The piece will be maintenance free other than occasional dusting.



My portfolio is evidence of my abilities as an artist. I have been successful completing many projects on time and always in budget. I would estimate this project could be completed in as little as eight weeks to begin upon receipt of the necessary license plates.

The project budget is as follows.

Plywood and fastening materials \$430.00 Studio assistance \$3300.00 Transportation and installation expenses \$1250.00 Artist fee \$5020.00

Total \$10,000.00
