RESOLUTION 19-

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF SURPLUS SECURITY SCANNERS TO THE UNION COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Alachua County, a Charter County pursuant to Article VIII, Section 1 (g), of the Florida Constitution, has all powers of local self-government not inconsistent with general law or with special law approved by vote of the electors; and,

WHEREAS, Section 125.38, Florida Statutes, authorizes counties to lease or convey surplus property to the United States government, the state or any agency, political subdivision, or municipality thereof, or to certain not for profit organizations, subject to specified criteria; and,

WHEREAS, under Florida law the Union County Sheriff's Office is a Florida Constitutional Officer pursuant to Article VIII, Section 1(d), of the Florida Constitution and has powers and duties as enumerated in Chapter 30, Florida Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, Alachua County has declared Metorex (Metor 200) Security Scanners as surplus property to their needs and the Union County Sheriff's Office has requested that Alachua County donate said surplus property to them to support public safety in Union County; and,

WHEREAS, the Alachua County Clerk of Court and Board of County Commissioners have determined that said property, formerly used for the public's safety and welfare, is no longer needed for County purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners approves donation of said property; and,

WHEREAS, Section 274.07, Florida Statutes, requires that the disposal of tangible personal property be recorded in the Minutes of the Board of County Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that this conveyance complies with Chapters 125 and 274, Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

- 1. The Board hereby authorizes and approves the donation of the surplus Metorex Security Scanners to the Union County Sheriff's Office.
- 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
