**Commissioner Cornell** 

The Clark's memo raised two issues, the status of the vacation of plat application and prior County actions in connection with the Clark's dispute with their neighbor.

1. Status of plat vacation - The application to vacate the North 1/3 of the High Springs Manor Plat is loaded into Granicus/Legistar and is on the BoCC Agenda for January 14, 2020. The resolution authorizing advertising of this item was adopted November 12, 2019 and public notice is scheduled for publication in the Gainesville Sun for December 17 and December 24, 2019. Staff has reviewed the application and attachments (as modified) and is recommending approval of the partial plat vacation.


The Clarks have raised the issue of obtaining a Title Search 3 separate times. The first Title Search provided by applicant, dated May 22, 2018, was for the wrong property. This Title Report covered the "Middle 1/3" of the High Springs Manor Plat, while the application was for the vacation of the North 1/3 of the plat. When advised of their error, applicant provided a new Title Search dated August 24, 2018 for the correct property.

County staff obtained approval at the August 28, 2018 BoCC meeting to authorize advertising of the proposed vacation. Staff then placed the vacation of the plat on the agenda for the September 25, 2018 BoCC meeting. Prior to that meeting, applicant pulled the item and explained that they were attempting to acquire the last lot in the area to be vacated. Applicant was unsuccessful in their attempt to obtain the final lot.

In May 2019 applicant instructed County staff to restart the vacation process, without vacating the final lot or means of convenient access to that lot. Staff informed applicant that the Title Search would need to be updated, due to the delay caused by applicant pulling the previously scheduled vacation petition. On August 6, 2019 applicant provided Search Update No. 1 and staff restarted the plat vacation process.

2. Prior County actions — Alachua County Public Works Department action on this matter began with the vacation of the South 2/3 of the High Springs Manor plat on October 23, 2007 by Resolution 07-97. This vacation did not include perimeter rights-of-way around the platted subdivision, which provide access to adjoining property owners. On September 7, 2017, County

Engineer Ramon Gavarrete, P.E. sent a letter to the Clarks informing them that the disputed right-of-way along the north border of the High Springs Manor plat was a public right-of-way and requiring the Clarks to remove a gate placed across the right-of-way. The Clarks did not remove the gate and on September 22, 2017 the Alachua County Public Works Department removed the gate. On October 1, 2018 County Surveyor Charles Brecken, PSM surveyed the location of the dirt roadway within the right-of-way. The survey disclosed that no part of the dirt road extended beyond the south boundary of the right of-of-way onto the Clarks' property. The Clark's then submitted the application for vacation of plat discussed in Item one, above.

Mr. Clark:

County staff has verified that the north 25-foot un-named platted street as shown in the plat of High Springs Manor, recorded in Plat Book B, page 71 of the public records of Alachua County is a public platted right of way. The High Springs Manor plat dedicated the streets to the public forever as shown. The plat was approved and accepted by the Board of County Commissioners in 1926. On August 9, 2016 the County adopted Resolution 16-71, recorded in Official Records Book 4455, page 2047 accepting ownership of the platted right of ways shown on recorded plats that contained dedications.

The said 25-foot platted right of way reference above is a public right of way and is available for the use by the public; including any adjacent property owners. Alachua County staff was notified that you recently installed two posts and a gate across the platted right of way. Please remove the chain and open the gate immediately. You have 15 days from the receipt of this letter to remove the two posts and gate. Alachua County will make a site visit on September 22, 2017, or shortly thereafter, to verify that the posts and gate have been removed. If not removed, the County will remove and store for 15 days at the Public Works Compound where you will have to pick it up at your expense. After 15 days, the items will be disposed.

Resolution 07-97 vacated only the south 2/3 of the plat LESS Santa Fe Street, Bay Street and the 15-foot un-named Street across the south end of said plat. Copies of both Resolutions are included for informational purposes.
