9	designation. The correction of typographical errors that do not affect the intent of the ordinance mag
10	be authorized by the County Manager or designee, without public hearing, by filing a corrected or
11	re-codified copy of the same with the Clerk of the Circuit Court.
12	SECTION 6. Effective Date. A certified copy of this ordinance shall be filed with the
13	Department of State by the Clerk of the Board within ten (10) days after enactment by the Board
14	and shall take effect upon filing with the Department of State.
