


# Draft Community Redevelopment Economic Development

### **Professional Service Grants**

Encourages job skills training, education and entrepreneurship

Addresses Slum and Blight conditions

Takes into account economic disparities identified in the "Understanding Racial Inequity in Alachua County" Report (2018)

Coordinates with other redevelopment and economic opportunities in the surrounding area

Estimates the number of new jobs, and or the creation, retention, expansion of businesses
