Dear Chairman Hutchinson:

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") has reviewed the proposed comprehensive plan amendment for Alachua County (Amendment No. 19-03ESR) received on December 18, 2019. The review was completed under the expedited state review process. We have no comment on the proposed amendment.

The County should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment. In addition, the County is reminded that:

- Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., authorizes other reviewing agencies to provide comments directly
 to the County. If the County receives reviewing agency comments and they are not resolved,
 these comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.
- The second public hearing, which shall be a hearing on whether to adopt one or more comprehensive plan amendments, must be held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments or the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to the Department and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(c)1., F.S.
- The adopted amendment must be rendered to the Department. Under Section 163.3184(3)(c)2. and 4., F.S., the amendment effective date is 31 days after the Department notifies the County that the amendment package is complete or, if challenged, until it is found to be in compliance by the Department or the Administration Commission.

Pursuant to Section 163.3184(3), Florida Statutes, (F.S.) in its role as a reviewing agency as identified in Section 163.3184(1)(c), F.S., the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) reviewed the proposed amendment, Alachua County 19-3ESR.

Alachua County has transmitted a Large Scale Future Land Use Map (FLUM) Amendment to redesignate the land use of 25.64 acres Institutional to Medium-High Density Residential. The site is located on the west side of Fort Clarke Boulevard, approximately 0.25 miles north of SR-26 (Newberry Road). The existing Institutional land use allows for a variety of uses and is subject to policies and standards in the Comprehensive Plan and Land Development Code. The proposed Medium-High Density Residential land use allows a maximum of 358 multi-family dwelling units (14 DU/Acre)

As proposed, the land use amendment will result in 151 PM Peak Hour Trips (ITE LUC 221). The segment of SR-26 from NW 143rd Street to NW 76th Boulevard will have sufficient capacity for the proposed trips in the near and future planning horizon (2020 and 2030). The proposed amendment has no significant impact on important state transportation resources or facilities within its jurisdiction.

We appreciate the opportunity to review the proposed comprehensive plan amendment and request that a copy of the adopted amendment, along with the supporting data and analysis be transmitted within ten working days after the second public hearing for FDOT review.

Pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, Council review of local government comprehensive plan amendments is limited to adverse effects on regional resources and facilities identified in the strategic regional policy plan and extrajurisdictional impacts that would be inconsistent with the comprehensive plan of any affected local government within the region. A written report containing an evaluation of these impacts, pursuant to Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, is to be provided to the local government and the state land planning agency within 30 calendar days of receipt of the amendment.

DESCRIPTION OF AMENDMENT

County item CPA-05-19 reclassifies approximately 25.64 acres from Institutional to Medium-High Density Residential (greater than 8, up to 14 Dwelling Units per acre) (see attached).

1. ADVERSE EFFECTS TO SIGNIFICANT REGIONAL RESOURCES AND FACILITIES IDENTIFIED IN THE STRATEGIC REGIONAL POLICY PLAN

The subject property is located adjacent to State Road 26 and within one-half mile Interstate 75, both of which are identified as part of the Regional Road Network as mapped in the North Central Florida Strategic Regional Policy Plan. Regional Plan Transportation Element Policy 5.1.1 states that within urban service areas and urban development areas where local government comprehensive plans contain goals and policies which implement Transportation Planning Best Practices, adverse impacts to the Regional Road Network are adequately mitigated and local government plans and plan amendments are not subject to a Regional Planning Council determination of impacts to the Regional Road Network. The County Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element contains policies consistent with Best Transportation Planning Practices contained in the North Central Florida Strategic Regional Policy Plan. Therefore, significant adverse transportation impacts to the Regional Road Network are adequately mitigated.

The subject property is located within a Stream-to-Sink Watershed and an Area of High Recharge Potential to the Floridan Aquifer as identified and mapped in the North Central Florida Strategic Regional Policy Plan. Nevertheless, significant adverse impacts are not anticipated as the County Comprehensive Plan contains goals and policies to mitigate impacts to the Natural Resource of Regional Significance.

2. EXTRAJURISDICTIONAL IMPACTS INCONSISTENT WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE PLANS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WITHIN THE REGION

The County Comprehensive Plan, as amended, is not anticipated to create significant adverse impacts to adjoining local governments.
