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31	Whereas, on June 8, 2020 the City of Newberry, Florida, adopted Ordinance Number				
32	2020-13 on second reading, annexing approximately 118 acres of unincorporated property into				
33	the City of Newberry; and,				
34	WHEREAS, the Municipal Annexation or Contraction Act, Chapter 171, Florida				
35	Statutes, sets forth criteria and procedures for adjusting the boundaries of municipalities through				
36	annexation or contraction, as well as the procedures for appealing annexation or contraction				
37	decisions; and,				
38	WHEREAS, Section 171.081, Florida Statutes, provides that a government agency that				
39	chooses to challenge a municipal annexation must first initiate and proceed through the Florida				

40	Governmental Conflict Resolution Act, Chapter 164, Florida Statutes, prior to filing a petition in			
41	the circuit court seeking certiorari review; and,			
42	WHEREAS, the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act provides that the purpose			
43	and intent of that Act is to promote, protect, and improve the public health, safety, and welfare			
44	and to enhance intergovernmental coordination efforts by the creation of a governmental conflic			
45	resolution procedure that can provide an equitable, expeditious, effective, and inexpensive			
46	method for resolution of conflicts between and among local and regional governmental entities;			
47	and,			
48	WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Florida Legislature that conflicts between			
49	governmental entities be resolved to the greatest extent possible without litigation; and,			
50	WHEREAS, Section 164.1052, Florida Statutes, provides that in order for a governing			
51	body of a governmental entity to initiate the conflict resolution procedures provided by this Act			
52	it shall first adopt a resolution by its members; and,			
53	WHEREAS, said resolution is required to state that it is the intention of the governing			
54	body initiating the conflict resolution procedures to resolve the conflict; and,			
55	WHEREAS, said resolution is required to specify the issues of conflict, as well as the			
56	governmental entity or entities with which the governing body has a conflict; and,			
57	WHEREAS, Section 164.1041, Florida Statutes, provides that all governmental entities			
58	are encouraged to use the procedures in this act to resolve conflicts that may occur at any time			
59	between governmental entities, but shall use these procedures before court proceedings.			
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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

- 1. The Board of County Commissioners of Alachua County intends to initiate the conflict resolution procedures provided by the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act, prior to prosecuting a court proceeding, through the adoption of this Resolution.
- The conflict is between the government and Board of County Commissioners of
 Alachua County and the government and City Commission of the City of Newberry.
- 71 3. On June 8, 2020, the City of Newberry Commission adopted Ordinance Number 72 2020-13 annexing approximately 118 acres of unincorporated property into the City of 73 Newberry.
 - 4. Alachua County contends that, in addition to that which may be pled or further described in court proceedings, the following are issues of conflict between Alachua County and the City of Newberry:
 - a. That the City of Newberry Ordinance 2020-13, which annexes approximately 118 acres of unincorporated property into the City of Newberry, does not meet the requirements for annexation found in Chapter 171, Florida Statutes, in that the land annexed into the City of Newberry is not reasonably compact as required by Section 171.044(1), Florida Statutes, and as defined in Section 171.031(12), Florida Statutes.
 - b. The County will suffer material injury by reason of the City's failure to comply with the requirements of Chapter 171, Florida Statutes, because the County will lose current and future tax revenue, and the annexation will create interjurisdictional conflicts related to planning and growth management and inefficiencies related to service delivery.
 - 5. It is the intent of Alachua County, to the greatest extent possible, to resolve this dispute without litigation.

88	6.	Pursuant to Section 1	71.081, Florida Statutes, Alachua County hereby initiates the		
89	procedures of the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act. Following the completion of				
90	the procedures of the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act, Alachua County may file a				
91	petition in the circuit court seeking review by certiorari, pursuant to Section 171.081, Florida				
92	Statutes.				
93	7.	The Board of County	Commissioners of Alachua County directs the County		
94	Manager and County Attorney to adhere to the procedural requirements and remedies as outlined				
95	in the Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act, Chapter 164, Florida Statutes.				
96	8. <u>Effective Date</u> . This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
