Call to Order

The hybrid meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m.

Approval of the Agenda

MOTION: Carol Velasquez Richardson made a motion to approve the agenda as presented; Queenchiku Ngozi seconded; unanimous approval; motion carried.

Approval of the Minutes

MOTION: Carol Velasquez Richardson made a motion to approve the May 3, 2021; June 7, 2021; and August 2, 2021 minutes as presented; Iryna Kanishcheva seconded; unanimous approval; motion carried.

Jack Durrance Loan Application & Agreement

MOTION: Carol Velasquez Richardson made a motion to recommend the Board approve an agreement with Leira Cruz Caliz and Bob Dornberg to loan their art to the County through the Jack Durrance Art Loan program; Queenchiku Ngozi seconded; unanimous approval; motion carried.

Call-to-Artists Update

West Lawn – Nine (9) suggestions were received. They will be forwarded to the Community Rememberance Project for review. Their top three will then be sent to the Historical Commission for vetting prior to submitting them to the County Commission for a final selection. The Arts Council will then issue the Call to Artists.

Fire Stations – The Call to Artists for Fire Stations 33 and 41 were discussed. Vice-Chair Kanishcheva made a presentation on the software we will use for the Fire Station 41 mural submittals and rankings. We will use our traditional Call to Artists process for the Fire Station 33 stained glass project.

Mini & Matching Grant Submittal Distribution

The Mini and Matching grant submittals were reviewed. Iryna Kanishcheva (Mini) and David Sutton (Matching) announced their conflicts and submitted the required conflict of interest forms (attached). **MOTION:** Iryna Kanishcheva made a motion to recommend \$1,000 each for the top four ranked Mini Grant applications: Johanna Weiss, Corey Cheval, Music GNV, and Y-Not Theatre; Queenchiku Ngozi seconded; unanimous approval; motion carried. **MOTION:** Queenchiku Ngozi made a motion to recommend \$1,500 each for the cities of High Springs and Newberry for the Matching Grant applications as their scores were tied; Carol Velasques Richardson seconded; unanimous approval; motion carried.

Artists Conference Discussion

Dr. Queenchiku Ngozi reported that we would likely get more participation if the Artist Conference was offered via Zoom. The consensus of the group was to pursue a hybrid option on a Friday in January, held in the County Administration Building, and make it free to attendees to give the group an opportunity to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of the conference. Additionally, the sponsorship funding received to date can be used to market the event and send lunch/snacks to registered participants.

Public Comment

Poet Laureate E. Stanley Richardson stated that the annual youth poetry event will be held on Sept. 19 at 5 p.m. at the Thomas Center. The event is free and open to the public.

WHO MUST FILE FORM 8B

This form is for use by any person serving at the county, city, or other local level of government on an appointed or elected board, council, commission, authority, or committee. It applies to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office MUST ABSTAIN from voting on a measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss. WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

APPOINTED OFFICERS:

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you are not prohibited by Section 112.3143 from otherwise participating in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

- · You must disclose orally the nature of your conflict in the measure before participating.
- You must complete the form and file it within 15 days after the vote occurs with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the
