FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT #10731 FOR CONTRACTUAL SERVICES BETWEEN ALACHUA COUNTY AND PRITCHETT TRUCKING, INC. FOR ANNUAL BACK-UP AND EMERGENCY, HAULING SERVICES BID #17-66

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Bid #17-66, the Parties hereto previously entered into the Agreement for Contractual Services Between Alachua County and Pritchett Trucking, Inc. for Annual Back-Up and Emergency Hauling Services Bid #17-66 dated November 14, 2017 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the County has elected to exercise its first option to renew the Term of the Agreement for a two year period commencing October 1, 2019 and continuing through September 30, 2021 ("First Renewal Option Term") and to reflect the increase to the Alachua County Minimum Wage as mandated by the Alachua County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 22, Article III ("Wage Ordinance"); and,

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to amend the Agreement as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties hereby agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

A. SECTION # 1 of the Agreement, Term, is amended in its entirety to read:

- 1.1 The County has elected to exercise its first option to renew the Term of the Agreement. Accordingly, the Term of the Agreement is renewed for the period commencing October 1, 2019 and continuing through and ending September 30, 2021 (the "First Renewal Option Term"), unless earlier terminated as provided herein. The County has the option of renewing this Agreement for one (1) additional two (2) year period at the same terms and conditions outlined herein.
- 1.2 The County's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement is contingent upon a specific annual appropriation by the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners ("Board"). The Parties hereto understand that this Agreement is not a commitment of future appropriations. Therefore, the continuation of this Agreement beyond the end of any fiscal year shall be subject to both the appropriation

and the availability of funds in accordance with Chapter 129, Florida Statutes, and that the failure of the Board to do so shall not constitute a breach or default of this Agreement.

- B. Sub-paragraph 5.1 and 5.2 are amended in their entirety to read as follows:
- 5.1. As of October 1, 2019, the current required Alachua County Government Minimum Wage is \$14.00 per hour when health benefits are provided at the equivalent value of \$2.17 per hour.
- 5.2. As of October 1, 2019, the current required Alachua County Minimum Wage is \$16.17 per hour when health benefits are not provided.
- C. This First Amendment shall take effect upon the date of execution by both Parties.
- **D. SAVE and EXCEPT** as expressly amended herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement shall be and remain in full force and effect.

Description:

Amendment to agreement with Pritchett Trucking, Inc. for back-up and emergency hauling of waste from the Leveda Brown Environmental Park and Transfer Station. This amendment extends the term through Sept. 30, 2021.

Recommended Action:

Approve the First Amendment to Agreement and authorize the chair to sign it.

Prior Board Motions:

On November 14, 2017, the BOCC approved the original Agreement with Pritchett Trucking, Inc. for back-up and emergency hauling services.

Fiscal Consideration:

Sufficient funds exist in fund 400.76.7631.534.42.00 to cover this agreement. The total encumbered in FY2018-19 was \$130,000.00 which is amount budgeted in FY19-20.

Background:

To assist the Leveda Brown Environmental Park in its ability to transport the approximately 700-800 tons of waste collected each day in Alachua County in a timely manner, it is necessary to utilize a back-up hauler at times due to vehicle breakdowns or instances of higher than normal waste generation. These services were advertised for bid in 2017, under Bid #17-66. Pritchett Trucking, Inc. was the only responsive bidder. On Nov. 14, 2017, the BOCC approved the contract #10731 with Pritchett Trucking, Inc. for back-up and emergency hauling.
