The Arts Council of Alachua County reviewed the artists' work submitted by Eboni Browning, Robert Dornberg, Mary Reichardt, Joyce Hinkle, and Karen Thomas at their July 1 meeting, to ensure that

each piece proposed for approval at today's meeting meets the Program requirements. The Council unanimously recommended the Commission approve contracts for these applications.
