Second Amendment to Agreement #10928 between Alachua County and the CHILD Center to revise the project budget for contractual purchases with the Early Learning Coalition to add another Implementation Coach, training and incentives, with no change to the overall budgeted amount.

Approve the Second Amendment and authorize Chair signature.

Prior Board Motions:

On January 24, 2017 the BoCC heard a presentation from the CSAB regarding its three (3) strategic initiatives, i.e., nurse home visit program, transforming professional development for early education, and the healthy social and emotional development and family supports. Commissioner Pinkoson moved to accept the overall plan and the three initiatives. The motion carried 5-0. At the February 13, 2018 BoCC meeting, Commissioner Byerly moved to approve the award of \$439,228.00 to the CHILD Center for its model demonstration site. The motion carried 5-0. On May 22, 2018 the BoCC approved the original agreement between Alachua County and the CHILD Center, Consent Agenda Item #23. On March 26, 2019 the BoCC approved the Frist Amendment to the CHILD Center agreement, Consent Agenda Item #16.
