Revenue of \$163,250 to the BoCC.

### Background:

The Children's Trust of Alachua County (CTAC) is a newly formed Independent Special District with Taxing Authority created by voter referendum in November 2018. The Trust is in its early formative stages and has no budget authority or financial resources until after October 1, 2019. CTAC desires

to purchase certain financial, accounting, and administrative services from the Alachua County BoCC for a one year period of time as it considers its own staffing and other administrative functions. CTAC is in the process of developing its first employee job description and related materials for the position of Executive Director.
