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Background:

SDI Gainesville Archer Road, LLC wishes to take advantage of Unified Land Development Code (ULDC) Section 407.125.3, the Multi-Modal Transportation Mitigation (MMTM) Program for the

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development of a drive-through restaurant. This program requires an agreement between the County and the applicant. The applicant has submitted a development plan for approval. The applicant has chosen to satisfy its transportation system mitigation obligations through the MMTM program. The MMTM agreement is necessary for the applicant to be able to mitigate for the transportation impacts of the development.
